Judith Barbara Weiss-Katz, aged 79, passed away on Monday August 21st after an extended illness. She was born in Cleveland, OH to Esther Ryshen and Sam Sells.

Judith was renowned for her kindness, humor, sensitivity, generosity, thoughtfulness, and love of life. She graduated from Cleveland Heights High School and later went on to earn a BA in Art Therapy from Ursuline College. In addition to working as an art therapist, Judith was a writer for the Suburban News and a pre-school teacher at the Fuchs Mizrahi School. Judith also used her creative talents to start a business creating original Victorian hat boxes and greeting cards.

Judith is survived by her husband of 38 years, Eugene Katz.
